Riverview Teen Selected as The First Tee Scholar

Tampa, FL, (December 17, 2012) – Ashante Sanders from The First Tee of Tampa Bay, a program of the Tampa Metropolitan Area YMCA that introduces young people to the game of golf and its inherent values, has earned the national designation of The First Tee Scholar - Class of 2013.

17-year-old Sanders is a senior at Riverview High School in Riverview, Florida. She embodies the leadership skills and characteristics that define The First Tee Scholars. Active at her chapter for eight years, she's participated in The First Tee Life Skills and Leadership Academy and coaches younger participants at the chapter. She also volunteers to help neglected animals at Critter Adoption and Rescue Effort (C.A.R.E.). At her high school, Sanders is captain of the golf team and a newspaper copy editor. She was also selected to represent The First Tee of Tampa Bay at the 2011 The First Tee of Tampa Bay Toro Future Leaders Forum at Disney World. In addition, Sanders is a member of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office Rising Star Leadership Academy and the National Society for High School Scholars.

"I want to thank The First Tee for providing me with such great opportunities, especially with their life lessons and educational growth in athleticism. I also want to thank my coach, Jeff Leonard, and my parents who taught me to do my best at everything," says Sanders.

The First Tee Scholars Program recognizes participants for exceptional achievement in academics, leadership, character development and chapter and community involvement. Applications are accepted once per year from seniors in high school who meet the minimum requirements and are scored by an independent committee. With this designation, Sanders has the opportunity to apply for any educational scholarship programs offered through The First Tee to attend a participating college or university.

Since 2003, the program has designated 521 scholars and funded 100 scholarships worth more than \$900,000. More than 20 colleges and universities throughout the United States have partnered with The First Tee to offer merit-based or leadership scholarships that help to offset the cost of attending school.

The First Tee of Tampa Bay, an official program of the Tampa Metropolitan Area YMCA, provides more than 38,000 children each year with hands-on, interactive golf experiences. Through the game of golf, The First Tee of Tampa Bay provides young people educational programs that build character, instill life-enhancing values and promote healthy choices.
